Advantages of wet dog food

- Higher moisture content - If your dog doesn't drink much water, wet food could help them maintain healthy hydration levels.
- Appealing flavour - Due to its meaty taste and aroma, wet food is often more enticing than dry food, making it a good choice for dogs that have lost their appetite due to age or illness.
- Easier to chew - Wet food is much softer than dry food, so it can be gentler on the mouths of dogs who have sore teeth or gums.
- Helps maintain a healthy body condition - wet food provides around a quarter the calories of dry food on a gram for gram basis. which helps keep a dog trim.

Disadvantages of wet dog food

- It spoils if left out - It's important that wet dog food isn't left out at room temperature for too long as it can spoil. Once a pack is opened, it should be refrigerated to keep it fresh, and eaten within a few days.
- It's got a stronger smell than dry food - The aroma may be what makes wet food more appealing for our furry friends, but it's not always so appealing for the human family members.
- It doesn't suit all budgets - Dog owners on a smaller budget may find it more cost-effective to buy a big bag of dry food.

What ingredients commonly make up wet food?

Wet dog food is usually made up of protein-rich chunks of meat or fish, combined with vegetables and grains, and enriched with essential vitamins and minerals. It tends to come in tins, trays, or pouches, and you can find varieties in a juicy gravy, sauce, jelly, or pate form.

What does wet food contribute to your dog's diet?

It's important to look for wet food that is complete and balanced, as this means it contains

all the nutrients your dog needs to stay healthy. Wet food is high in protein, due to the meat or fish, while other natural ingredients and supplements add fibre, antioxidants, and other goodness to their diet.

Choosing the right food for your dog
